Quakers Coppice Nest Box Breeding Results - 2016

This season 38 boxes were monitored and the tables below are a summary of the data compiled. In keeping with tradition in this Newsletter, we offer the last five years data for comparison ...

Over the 20+ years that the monitoring has taken place the 40+ boxes have been erected: -

small hole (Tit boxes)

19 (16 supplied in '85 by CWT)
large hole (Stock Dove boxes)

15 (the bulk erected in '91)

chimney style (Owl boxes) 2 wedge style (Treecreeper) 3

Stock Doves breeding season extends beyond our recording period, so the data is incomplete

Observations: -

26 nests in 22 boxes (4 boxes were used twice by Stock Doves)

Occupancy - Small Hole – 13 of 21; Treecreeper – one; Stock Dove/Owl - 6 of 15 (4 boxes used twice). Nuthatches failed to fledge the 5 eggs of a clutch of 8.

Treecreepers raised successfully 2 juveniles for a clutch of 5. Colin introduced a new style of Treecreeper box a few years ago. It's taken a while, but a pair of Treecreepers used it for the first time this year.

Crunching the data has revealed that Blue Tits 'survival' in 2016 (i.e. eggs / fledge ratio) is 40% lower than in the past 7 years. Great Tits are down by a similar figure – 2008 being the last year it was this low.
