Ten sets of records were returned again this year, covering both rural and urban gardens.

A total of 42 species was recorded, four more than last year, and once again starlings and house sparrows were present in the greatest numbers in all gardens.

Greenfinches, blue tits and chaffinches also maintained high populations, but song thrushes and coal tits were still in very short supply.

The winter was colder and wetter than in the previous two years with frosts down to minus 7°C.

The participants in this survey are listed along with the results, which are attached.

Many thanks to all who took part and in anticipation of your continued interest record sheets are enclosed for the coming winter.
