

## Pennington Flash - 7th October

Thirteen members enjoyed a trip to Pennington Flash.

43 bird species were recorded, including: shoveler, gadwall, teal, pochard, tufted duck, goosander, water rail, little grebe, great crested grebe, oystercatcher, green sandpiper, little egret, kestrel, jay, coal tit, willow tit, Cetti's warbler, goldcrest, nuthatch, and treecreeper.

## Wirral - 26th October



Fifteen members met at the Wirral Way Ropewalk car park at

Parkgate, where Tom outlined our itinerary for the day. The morning was blustery with occasional light showers, but spirits were high as we set off through the woodland strip, where a sparrowhawk gave us an early thrill as it flashed through the trees.

On reaching the King Charles III Way, two marsh harriers were seen quartering the marsh, soon followed by a little egret and then a great white egret. A real highlight came when a bittern appeared briefly, flying low over the reeds before dropping out of sight. A nearby Cetti's warbler offered a few brief, subdued notes – a quiet version of its usual explosive song.

Retracing our steps along the Way, we arrived at The Parade, where a kestrel hovered close by, holding its position perfectly in the gusty wind. After lunch, a few members returned hoping to see spoonbills. None appeared, but there was a black-tailed godwit, several little grebes, plenty of teal, and a distant flock of pink-footed geese in flight over the marsh.

At Thurstaston, some members followed the coastal path south along the clifftop and were rewarded with more than a hundred lapwings rising from a nearby field, along with several curlews and two shelducks on the shoreline. Others descended the steep steps to the beach, where more black-tailed godwits were seen, along with redshank and bar-tailed godwit. Hundreds of oystercatchers gathered on a distant sandbank to the south.

The day concluded at Hoylake, where hundreds of feeding shelducks and oystercatchers created a fine spectacle, accompanied by smaller numbers of curlews, great black-backed gulls and herring gulls. Several long lines of cormorants stood like sentinels to round off an enjoyable and windswept day's birding along the Wirral coast.
