

SECOS Garden Bird Survey 1986/7

The Garden Bird Survey was carried out for the second winter from October 1986 through to April 1987 with 19 members participating during this period. The survey produced some valuable data on bird species and numbers in gardens as well as giving participants a greater sense of purpose to their garden bird-watching.

The weather during the survey period is briefly summarised as follows:from October to December it was exceptionally mild with only occasional
overnight frosts, the only period of really cold weather started on 7th
January with freezing temperatures through to the 20th. Snow on the 14th
stayed for a week. Thereafter, although there were overnight frosts there was
no period of continuous freezing. Occasional snow showers and frequent heavy
rain with some mild spells to the end of March.

The very mild weather to the end of the year no doubt accounted for the quiet time in the garden, with only average numbers of the common species being recorded. However, early January saw a big increase in the number of species being recorded for the first time this winter. these included redwing, fieldfare, woodpigeon, rook, siskin, yellowhammer, goldfinch, linnet, reed bunting and brambling which were driven to look in gardens for their food.

The other notable feature was that numbers of the already present common birds did not show much of an increase (perhaps they had already got a garden to go to!)

A grand total of 51 species was recorded during the winter with the 10 most common being blue tit, blackbird, starling, house sparrow, robin, great tit, chaffinch, magpie, dunnock and greenfinch. Nine of these were in last year's top ten with collared dove dropping down to 11 and magpie coming in at 8. Meadow pipit, grey wagtail, lesser spotted woodpecker and feral pigeon were new species recorded for the first time this year.

I have been asked by one or two people whether birds not actually standing in the garden are eligible for inclusion. To clarify the position I would say that all birds flying over the garden and associated with it (e.g. sparrowhawk looking for prey) are eligible for inclusion but birds which just happen to be flying over (e.g. flocks of redwing or a herring gull moving past) are not. However, if these are records which you think I would be interested in then please record them on the page for comments.

I have taken this opportunity to send you recording sheets for the coming winter in anticipation of your continuing support for the survey. I enclose a list of all participants and registration numbers, please continue to use the registration number which you have. I have amended the forms to include a space for your name.

Many thanks for your efforts of last winter and good luck for next winter.
